#### The Entrance Rite

Today we follow Christ from triumphal entry to the cross, each waypoint of the journey marked by Jesus' compassion for those who would betray, mock, accuse, or do violence to him. Though persecuted and beaten, Jesus the Son of God is not disgraced; instead, he asks forgiveness for those who put him to death. We have walked the Lenten pathway these forty days, each of us invited through baptism to "let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus." We enter this holy week accompanying Jesus to the cross with both grief and thanksgiving in our hearts, trusting in God's redeeming love.



#### \*The First Lesson: Isaiah 50:4a-9

The image of the servant of God is one of the notable motifs in the book of Isaiah. Today's reading describes the mission of the servant, whom early Christians associated with Jesus. Like Jesus, the servant does not strike back at his detractors but trusts in God's steadfast love.

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher,
that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word.
Morning by morning he wakens—
 wakens my ear
 to listen as those who are taught.
The Lord God has opened my ear,
 and I was not rebellious,
 I did not turn backward.
I gave my back to those who struck me,
 and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard;
I did not hide my face
 from insult and spitting.

therefore I have not been disgraced;

therefore I have set my face like flint,

and I know that I shall not be put to shame;


## \*The Second Lesson: Philippians 2:5-11

Christ did not act to attain status and glory but was obedient to God even to the point of death. Following Christ's example, we do not seek personal status or glory but care for others as God cared for us in Christ's death.

<sup>5</sup>Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,
<sup>6</sup>who, though he was in the form of God,
did not regard equality with God
as something to be exploited,
<sup>7</sup>but emptied himself,
taking the form of a slave,
being born in human likeness.
And being found in human form,
<sup>8</sup>he humbled himself
and became obedient to the point of death—
even death on a cross.


<sup>9</sup>Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, <sup>10</sup>so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup>and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

## The Gospel Lesson: Luke 22:14-23:56

## P (The Gospel Lesson is announced)



Through the teachings and events of the passion story we see and hear the great contradictions that characterize the coming of God's reign. The leader serves the followers, proud Peter is revealed in his cowardice, and Jesus—the innocent bringer of life—is arrested, beaten, executed, and buried.

Today's Passion reading will be recited by our youth. When the narrator states "And the people said" the congregation will respond with the bold. Now let us follow along with St. Luke's telling of the Passion of Our Lord.

P: And the people said:

C: No, not a thing

P: And the people said:

C: Lord, look, hear are two swords.

P: And the people said:

C: Lord, should we strike with the sword?

P: And the people said:

C: Prophesy! Who is it that struck you?

C: If you are the Messiah, tell us.

C: What further testimony do we need? We have heard it ourselves from his own lips!

C: We found this man perverting our nation, forbidding us to pay taxes to the emperor, and saying that he himself is the Messiah, a king.

C: He stirs up the people by teaching throughout all Judea, from Galilee where he began even to this place.

C: Away with this fellow! Release Barrabas for us!


P: And the people said:






